Quality Catholic Schools Survey- Commencing this week, sixty families have been randomly selected to participate in this survey. This is a valuable initiative for all Catholic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta to continue our focus on improving the learning outcomes of every student and ensuring our teachers have professional and rewarding working lives.

All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta are participating in QCS which will help to build on our successes to date and to identify ways in which we can continue to improve. As this is the second year of the survey, it will enable us to track our progress on those areas identified from last year's findings and included in our school planning.

Your views are very important and with the responses from staff and student surveys, will provide information about:

- Cultural behaviour
- Relationships
- Learning community

We have engaged external survey consultants, Insight SRC, to facilitate the collection and analysis of the data. For those families selected, your responses will not be available to your school or the Catholic Education Office (CEO) and individuals cannot be identified from the results, or from the information provided to schools or the CEO.

The value of QCS will be greatly enhanced by your thoughtful reflection on the areas surveyed. I thank those families selected for taking the time to complete the survey.

Safety and Consideration- I would like to remind everyone about the importance of safety around the school. Your children's safety is very important to all of us so I ask that no cars enter the staff car park. I have also noticed a number of people walking through the car park and I ask that you please set the example to your children by using the footpath either outside or inside the staff car park to ensure that we don't have any accidents. Thank you for your consideration for both of these things.

Enrolment 2016- I would just like to remind everyone that we have begun the process of enrolment for the 2016 school year. If you have a child beginning school next year now is the time to come and collect an enrolment form to begin this process. We also have some vacancies in some grades so if you know of anyone who is interested in enrolment your support and encouragement of St. Andrews is greatly appreciated.

Annual Diocesan Tuition Fee can be paid upfront at the start of the year or as three equal payments in Terms 1, 2 and 3. The fee is only charged for the first three (3) children currently enrolled in the diocese (in other words there is no additional Diocesan Tuition Fee for the fourth child attending a systemic school in the diocese or other participating Catholic schools – see 'Sibling Discounts' below.) To work out how much the fee is for each child, check the table below.




