Thank you to all those parents who were able to attend the Parent Information Evenings. The feedback that I had was very positive. The staff wish to thank you for your support. I know it is extremely difficult to fit everything into our busy lives but it important to your children that you have the information you need to ensure that your child has a successful year in their new classes. For those of you who were unable to attend I stressed how important it is for you to support your child's teacher during the year. The best way to do this is to keep yourselves fully informed, to ask questions if you are worried or concerned by your child's progress, to support your child's learning through their homework and particularly how they are progressing towards the grade's literacy and numeracy expectations. I expect that this year will again be a successful learning year for your children by following these simple suggestions and supporting your children's teachers.

To work hard is a tremendous value to develop early in life. I have spoken to some of the children about this. None of your children will reach their learning potential unless they do the hard work that is required to continue to develop. It is also great in preventing things like boredom setting in. Working hard is essential for the children in learning basic skills in Literacy and Numeracy which are the foundations to other learning. I would particularly encourage all the children to spend some home time with regularly reading. This is essential particularly for the children in Kinder, Year 1 and Year 2 in practicing their reading every night. The children will not be able to reach our expectations for them without the reading practice every night. It is important for parents with children in these grades to ensure that the children are doing this practice. If you are unsure of how to approach this please speak with your child's teacher.

P/F Meeting The first P/F meeting will be held on Monday, 24th February at 7pm. This is one way for you to contribute further to life of the school. I really appreciated the support at my previous school from the P/F. Being the principal can be a difficult task at times and I appreciate all the support that I can get. It would be nice to get a few people from every class group to come along to my first meeting.

Morning Drop Off One of the most important tasks for teachers is preparation and preparation for the day's learning takes place after official hours in most cases. Teachers as a condition of their employment must be at school thirty minutes before the scheduled start time (8:20am). Of course it would be impossible to run a school effectively if teachers stuck strictly to these minimal expectations. Teachers more often than not are here well before these times. In my first few weeks here at St Andrews I have been worried about the number of children that are here at school well before the start time of the school day and sitting outside the school gates. Just last week there was a police pursuit at high speed down breakfast road before the school starting time. It is not appropriate to be dropping children off at school before 8:20am as there is no teacher on duty until 8:20am. Morning supervision begins at 8:20am. If your child arrives before 8:20am and the gate is open they are to come in and sit down in the undercroft area until a teacher arrives at 8:20am for morning supervision. This should not be occurring on a regular basis. Your cooperation with this arrangement is appreciated. Please no students before 8:20am unless there is a family emergency.

After school pickup/parking. It is always difficult at the beginning of each new school year with dismissal in the afternoons. I would ask all of you to remember the importance of safety. Your children are precious and it is important that everyone is able to leave the school grounds safely. It is also important that we look after the schools neighbours in the afternoon and not block their driveways as does happen. I understand the difficulties with the pick up in the afternoons. Please do not enter the staff carpark, either in the morning or afternoon.

Staff Car Park

Parents are reminded **NOT** to park in staff car park. The practice of not parking in the car park has been establish for many reasons. The most important one is children's safety. There have been some very close mishaps with cars reversing and not seeing children. It would be terrible for an accident to occur before this practice is taken seriously.

PLEASE DO NOT PARK, DROP OFF OR PICK UP CHILDREN IN THE TEACHER'S CAR PARK.

Other alternatives for parking are:

NO 1 Zone: JPII Car Park:

Drive in the parking area, drive to the side gate near Father Ron's garage. Stop. Drop off the children, then drive on out of the car park. Don't allow children to exit the car until you come to a complete stop at the gate. Please have children alight from the passenger's side. The children enter the school grounds via the gate beside the Church.

No 2 Zone: Back Gate:

Come off the Falmouth Road onto Marampo Street then Caratel Crescent, Nunga Place. Drop the children off at the back walkway entrance then drive on. It will save you looking for a park.

Dropping Off Under the Church Portico- this practice is **ONLY** in the morning

- Children are to alight after the car has come to a complete stop under the church portico
- Children are to ONLY exit from the left hand doors
- Drivers remain in the car at all times
- Primary children enter the school through the top gates
- Infants children walk along the pathway and enter the school through the front gates
- No child should walk onto the driveway or need to walk through parked cars

No car is to be parked in this area of an afternoon – it is NOT a carpark.

Online Training Module—Child Protection for Volunteers

The online training module is a Catholic Education Office requirement that child protection training be completed by all volunteers commencing work in our schools and needs to be renewed every two years for existing volunteers. An online training module for use by volunteers is now available. After successfully completing the module, an email notification will be sent automatically to the volunteer's email address and to the Catholic Education Office email address. The email is a confirmation that the training has been successfully completed by the volunteer. A notification of successful completion of the module will be sent via e-mail to the school and also to the volunteer's email address.

Once you have completed this Online module the Catholic Education Office will advise us of your completion and you will receive a certificate to confirm this. Until you have received the certificate you cannot be added to our Current helpers list.

Allergies

Dear Parents

Schools cater for many differences that children present, academic, emotional, social and health issues.

Throughout our school, we have children with **life threatening** allergies. This is a serious matter, one that the school must address. Therefore, we appeal to all parents to assist us in caring for these children by considering the type of foods you pack for your own child's lunch.

Our aim is to minimize the amount of **peanut** and **nut** products brought into the school and avoid all foods that contain **nuts**. These foods are extremely dangerous to our children with allergies. Common foods that trigger an allergic reaction are listed below and we ask that they **not** be brought to school at **any time**.

- Cashews, hazelnuts, almonds, walnuts and all tree nuts
- ⇒ Peanut butter
- ⇒ Nutella
- ⇒ Sesame seeds remember some bread rolls have sesame seeds on them including some McDonald's hamburger buns
- ►⇒ Foods that contain satay e.g. Thai, Malaysian, Indonesian dishes
- ⇒ Chocolate blocks, biscuits and lollies
- ⇒ Whole egg boiled egg, curried egg

Our canteen does not sell any of the items above. In the case of a child bringing a nut product to school, teachers will bring the matter to the attention of parents.

If peanut or nuts are **not** on the ingredient list of a particular packaged food but the food has the statement:

"MAY CONTAIN TRACES OF NUT......"

this food may be brought to school and consumed only by **non-allergic children**.

Due to safety concerns, we discourage children from sharing food. We would also appreciate parents speaking with children regarding this matter.

■ We thank you for helping us to provide a safe environment for all of our children.
