From the Principal

I hope all the mums had a special day, last Sunday as the family honoured you for Mother's Day. A big thank you to everyone for your support of the Mothers Day stall. The money raised will be put to good use.

The Six Secrets of Being Successful- This week I thought I would share some reading I was doing over the weekend that you might like to share with your children about being successful at what ever they put their mind to....

- 1. Persevere- to be successful you must keep trying
- 2. You have to "do it" to succeed- in other words we learn to do things by doing them. You cannot expect to be a great reader if you never read a book. Likewise great writers write and so on.
- 3. Being successful is **not being lucky** don't wait for success to tap you on the shoulder.
- 4. **It takes time-** success wont happen overnight but it will happen- it takes regular practice over days, weeks, months and in some cases years.
- 5. **Be ordered-** having an organized work space, school book, uniform and environment helps you be successful.
  6. **Be cheerful-** those people with a happy disposition are more likely to succeed, research suggests. So try your hardest and keep a smile on your face!

At school we focus the children's time very efficiently onto learning and this term we have even created more time for learning with the changes to the school day, minimizing line up time and changing assemblies to the afternoon. Just like an athlete children need to complete a number of repetitions of a particular activity to make them competent in completing a particular task. We strongly encourage daily reading at home for 20 minutes as it

- Develops a love of reading
- Creates independence in your child
- Exposes the students to many thousands of words
- Develops your child as a reader

The 20 minutes can be made up of being read to by an adult, children reading their home reader and for the older more independent reader, silent reading

Nightly reading is critical to being a successful learner and to support you in your parental role this term Miss Figuero and the teachers began a morning Readers program. It's great to see the older students listening to and helping the younger students with their reading. The whole concept of our learning spaces is trying to encourage the children to collaborate with each other and this is a good example of how the children can support each other with their learning. Thank you to Miss Figuero and the staff for organizing this for the children. It is also a great way to avoid the cold mornings so I encourage all the children to take advantage of this time.

## Federal Budget 2014-15: No certainty on funding or direction says Catholic Schools Director

- The Federal Government's priority to cut the budget deficit will significantly reduce school funding in real terms and create greater uncertainty for schools says Executive Director of Schools, Greg Whitby.
- 'Catholic schools need certainty on two key areas: funding and direction,' said Greg. 'The Better Schools Plan (Gonski) which had given schools a clear mandate has been abandoned by the Federal government in this budget.'
- 'This 'back to the future' approach of devolving responsibility to the states and the constantly shifting educational focus is a distraction to the core work of improving schooling.'
- 'If Australia wants to be competitive internationally, we need a coherent, funded <u>national</u> policy framework for schools focused on the areas that makes the greatest difference. We know the focus needs to be on improving the quality of teaching by building professional expertise and practice,' he said.
- 'Cuts to AITSL and ACARA will significantly impact on the ability to deliver a national framework encompassing a national standard for teachers and leaders, and a national curriculum.'
- 'As funding will now be linked to the CPI, which is almost half the real cost of school expenditure, there are real concerns for the growing financial burden on families.'
- 'Government funding for Catholic schools beyond 2017 needs to keep pace with real school costs and we need a clear plan for capital funding given the expected demand for Catholic schools to rise by 350 nationally over the next 10 years.'
- 'We are committed to providing affordable, quality Catholic education for the families of western Sydney and will continue to invest our efforts into working with our teachers to improve the learning outcomes of each child in each school.'

#### Reporting to Parents

This term children will bring home their half yearly reports. Over the next few weeks information will be published in the newsletter to assist parents with our school's reporting process. Reports describe what your child can do and identifies areas where they may need help. Reports for Years 1 to 6 also provide a comparison of your child's achievement using the Common Grade Scale E to A. It is important that parents are aware that this E-A Scale differs from the one you may have experienced at school. Reports are only one way of gaining information about your child's learning. To gain the best information about your child's performance and how it can be improved is by attending Parent-Teacher interviews - Monday 23rd June, Tuesday 24th June and Wednesday 25th June.

E	The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.
D	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.

В	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills in most situations.


