# Year 6 Canberra Excursion

Our Year 6 Students undertook an educational tour of the National Capital on July 28 and 29 (Thursday and Friday Week 2).

Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

We visited the Australian War Memorial, the Australian Institute of Sport, Questacon, toured Parliament House to see the workings of the House of Representatives and the Senate, and took part in a Parliamentary Education Office session where students debated a Bill.

We also visited the Australian Electoral Commission in Old Parliament House where students learnt about Democracy and the voting process to elect our representatives in Federal Parliament.

The Australian Government recognizes the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of the Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

Students wanting to audition will have to complete an audition form from their class teacher. We ask parents to support your child in preparing them for the show and encouraging them to have-a-go.




