SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION PROGRAM FOR THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE (FIRST RECONCILIATION) AT ST ANDREW'S IN 2015

Dear Parents,

In the Diocese of Parramatta children are prepared for these Sacraments within a parish-based, family centred programme. This creates opportunities for parents to continue sharing their faith with their children.

Parents have an essential role in deciding when their children are ready to be prepared for the Sacraments. When their children are ready, parents and families are asked to commit to being involved in the full programme.

Children make their Sacraments in the Parish in which they reside or the Parish at which their family worships. If you are not a Parishioner of St Andrew's you will be required to make an appointment with the Priest or the Sacramental Coordinator.

When you choose to register your child, you will also be required to bring along their Baptism Certificate (unless they were baptised at St Andrew's).

The <u>Sacrament of First Reconciliation Programme</u> will take place in Term 3 of this year for children in Years 2 and above who have been baptised.

You might remember this Sacrament as the Sacrament of Confession or the Sacrament of Penance. Usually the Sacrament of First Reconciliation is received in Year 2 or at an age when the parents believe the child is ready. Children need to have received the Sacrament of Baptism first.

Parents are asked to register for this Program before it begins. All meetings are compulsory.

Registration Forms...

... may be collected from the Parish Office beginning from Monday 6th July 2014 between the hours of 9.00am to 4.00pm. These forms may also be collected from the Parish Office on Sunday 20th July between 9.30am and 11.30am.

Registration Evening: Tuesday 22nd July 2014 at 7.00pm in the Church

Classes: Sundays 2nd August, 9th August & 16th August 2015 [Classes begin with 8.45am Mass and conclude at approximately 11.30am]

The Sacrament of First Reconciliation will be celebrated on:

□ Saturday 22nd August, □ Saturday 29th August & □ Saturday 5th September (You may choose to receive the Sacrament of First Reconciliation on ANY ONE of the Saturdays listed above.)

The Sacramental Programmes in 2016 are usually advertised in the Parish Bulletin during the Christmas season. Children, who have received the Sacrament of Penance are eligible to make their First Holy Communion from Year 3 onwards. After receiving Holy Communion parents may then register their children for the Preparation Programme for the Sacrament of Confirmation from Year 5 onwards.

or 0409 727 035. We strongly urge parents to avoid making costly mistakes, buying instruments
off ebay that are not assembled / ready to play or are generally poor quality.

When you sign this form and return it, you agree to the following terms & conditions

- Lessons are available initially in groups of 6 depending on availability on violin, viola, cello or double bass.
- Group lessons will cost \$100.00 per student for a 30-minute lesson each term based on a minimum of 8 lessons per term.

Group lessons are often a great way to commence on an instrument and students are often motivated to learn with their friends.

- Total Fees are payable at the commencement of the term to the school office by Monday week 4.
- Teachers will teach a minimum of 8 lessons per term to allow for school excursions and public holidays.

The fees are \$100 per term.

- If the minimum of 8 lessons does not occur, due to the teacher being absent, then the teacher will reschedule a
 makeup lesson or the parents will receive a credit for that lesson the following term.
- If a student is absent from school or misses their lesson there will be no refunds or make up lessons.
- This system of group lessons gives access to the best quality tuition to the maximum number of students for the lowest possible cost. Private Individual lessons can cost upwards of \$300 a term.
- Our Music teachers are highly qualified and experienced. The lessons will be scheduled during class time according to the availability of the teacher but with consultation and coordination with the class teacher to minimise the disruption to quality teaching time.

Once lessons commence, if you wish to terminate lessons through the school, it is required that you give

6 weeks notice in writing to the school office.

This is so that the organisation and engagement of teachers is not disrupted to the detriment of other students in the group.

- It is expected that there will be performance opportunities for the many children who participate in the co-curricular
 program as part of a Whole school Orchestra.
- Admission to the School Orchestra in 2015 is not a 'given' if they receive lessons. From 2011 admission to the St. Andrew's Orchestra is now selective and based upon children's ability, consistent progression, attitude and attendance. Students must be progressing through regular practice at home and coming to lessons prepared with music folders, lead pencils and erasers.
- Students in the Orchestra must be punctual and attend practice weekly or they jeopardise their place. Mr Racz may
 invite new children and let others resume in the mid year intake following the annual CAPTIVATE concert.

Playing in an ensemble is one of the most exciting musical activities in which you can participate. This musical activity can continue on into secondary school through the "Captivate" ensembles being established throughout the Diocese.

Catholic Out of School Hours Care at St Andrew's is able to offer limited places for care on this day. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis, with priority given to families already enrolled at the service.

Opening Times: 6:30am to 6:30pm

Flat Fee: \$50.00 per child for the day, prior to Child Care Benefit deductions. Families that already attend COSHC on Fridays will have their regular fee deducted from the \$50.00 fee.

No further applications will be accepted after 1:00pm on Friday 19th June, 2015.
