Dear Parents,

Welcome back to Term 3. I hope you had a chance to spend some quality time with your children during the holiday break. There is just so much happening at the moment. We are at full speed ahead with lots of exciting things happening around the school. The building project is steaming ahead now with the roof on. We are hoping to move into the new spaces next term. In regards to this, much detailed planning has been happening behind the scenes to get the most out of the new facilities. The plan is to move Years 1 and Year 2 into the current double storey building occupied by Year 3 and Year 4. Year 3 and Year 4 will move into the new building and Year 5 and Year 6 will be moving to the current Year1 and Year 2 learning spaces. We are planning for this to happen at the beginning of term 4. This is when Stage 2 of the project begins with some demolition, remodelling and landscaping works taking place during the term 3 holiday break and into term 4. I imagine this might require quite a bit of change to movement around the school while this is in progress but we will keep you fully informed as we get closer to the time.

Year 4 Project based learning project- Last term the year 4 students were involved in a project regarding flexible learning spaces and the purchase of furniture for our new learning spaces. Next Thursday, 27th July, the children will be showcasing their learning for all interested parents in two sessions: Session 1- 2:50- 3:30pm and Session 2- 4:30- 5:30pm. All parents are welcome to attend even if your children are not in Year 4, as you might be interested in learning from the children about flexible learning spaces and why we are so excited to be able to provide such dynamic learning environments for the children.

Enrolment- We are continuing with interviews for kindergarten for next year. It is important for our resourcing that the school facilities are fully utilised. As parents you are the best people to promote our great school. Your positive talk in the community assists us in keeping our school highly regarded in the community. Your support with this is most appreciated. There is absolutely no doubt that we are providing an excellent education for your children. Just this week I received some fantastic compliments from my colleagues working in the central office congratulating the staff on the fantastic work they are doing with regards to your children's learning. Any school's journey is about continuous improvement and I can honestly say that the staff is working hard to ensure that we are continuously improving our practice for the benefit of the children.

Attendance- In term one, I indicated to parents that we have a 93% attendance goal for your children this year. We currently have the following attendance rates:

Kinder -83.6%

Year 1 - 81.4%

Year 2 - 78.8%

Year 3 - 92.9%

Year 4 - 84.4%

Year 5 - 81.5%

Year 6 - 84.7%

Congratulations to our Year 3 students on their attendance. To achieve the goal of 90% each child could have no more than 12 days absence for the year. During the holiday break, some families would have received a letter regarding their child's attendance. The letter was sent to those families where their child had already exceeded the 12 days. This letter was not sent to upset anyone but just a reminder of how many days your child has been absent from school for the first half of the year. Sometimes the number of days your child has been absent can add up quickly without you realising it. Sometimes your child can just be having a bad year with illness, sometimes you have taken them out for an approved holiday and sometimes, unfortunately, your child just has too many days off. The research shows that a child's attendance pattern in Kindergarten and Year One is a good indicator of their attendance for the rest of their schooling. It is important that your child attends school as frequently as possible, barring illness or special circumstances. We are trying to supply you with the information you need to assist us with our school goal for the benefit of your children. We will do our best to make every day a valuable learning experience for your children.

We look forward to term three being another busy and productive term as we continue to work together to ensure that the children build upon their learning. We have had a great year so far.

Dental Staff from Blacktown/Mt Druitt Dental Hospital Clinics

Years Kindy, 2, 4, and 6

with a short talk regarding oral health information and diet advice plus a

Free Dental Check - Tuesday 22nd August

The Dental staff will bring portable dental chairs and lights. The dental clinician will use sterilised equipment and wear a new pair of latex free gloves for each child.

Consent forms will be sent home for each child and should be returned as soon as possible to the teacher with all questions completed. Ticked **Yes or No** and signed by the parent/ guardian.

Each student (with **Medicare** Number and the consent form ticked **Yes** and **signed by a parent**) will be eligible to have a dental checkup.

A letter (result sheet) will be sent home with each child on the assessment day. This will indicate how the parent should follow-up the dental assessment.

Parents will not need to contact the dental clinic, unless otherwise indicated on their result sheet

The child's details will be entered onto the hospital computer data base and will remain confidential.

Treatment appointments will be offered on a prioritised basis and sent *directly to the child's address*. Students with *urgent treatment needs* will be offered treatment appointments first.

Parents may choose to make an appointment with their Private Dentist if the result sheet indicates their child requires treatment.

Children from grades 1, 3, 5 will not be assessed at school.

Parents with children in Pre-school, Years 1,3 & 5 or children suffering dental pain or trauma, may call the Western Sydney Local Health District call centre on:

Free * dental care is available at NSW public dental clinics for all children under 18 years of age.



NSW Health suggests all children aged 0-18 have a Dental check up every 1 to 2 years and

should have their teeth brushed twice a day with a fluoride toothpaste.
