From the Principal's Desk

We are just so busy when we are working paying the bills and raising the children and are constantly bombarded with all the bad news regarding the state of the world, we often forget about the most important part of our lives and how lucky we are to share in good family relationships and all the joy and fufilment this brings to us. I hope we all can enjoy a happy, successful and safe year as we work together in the best interests of the children.

As always, the excitement of a new group of Kinders beginning their school journey is a source of great joy to us all! During the first week they seem to have all settled in well and seem happy to be here which is a great sign. We wish all these little ones and the new families that have begun the journey here at St Andrews all the best for a happy and fulfilling year.

Parent Information Evenings will be held at 7pm on Mon 9th Feb (Years 1/2), Wed 11th Feb (Years 3/4), Thurs, 12 Feb (year 5/6). Kindergarten Information night will be held on Mon 16th Feb at 7pm. This is a great opportunity to meet with your child's teacher to find out how the class will be organized throughout the year. The teachers will also be asking for parent helpers for the classrooms on this night. The more support we can get from you the easy it will be for your children to reach their full potential.

Your child will learn best when they know that you are interested in what they are doing. One way you can show that interest is by your attendance at the parent information evenings. It is a chance for you and your children's new teacher to meet to discuss the year's activities and for you to learn about the class routines for the year.

As I always do at the beginning of each year I want to encourage you to take an active interest in your child's education and try to get up to the school to help. If you have any questions or concerns I encourage you to speak with your children's teachers, the Coordinators Stage 1 Miss Joanne Figuero, Stage 2- Mr Graham Paynter Stage 3-. Mr Adam

Fletcher. I am always available to speak with you to answer questions or clarify anything. Please don't hesitate as you will always be given an honest response. It is always good to hear from you and give another perspective.

P/F Committee- This year we thought we would have our first meeting on Monday 23rd February at 7pm. We are always looking for some people to help on this important committee. As with hospitals, schools rely on fundraising to purchase resources that we would otherwise not have. It is also a fun way to meet and enjoy each other's company. I would ask that you strongly consider attending and lending your support to this committee especially some of our new parents.

Renovations- We had some fantastic renovations done over the school holiday period in the Year 3/4 learning spaces. We are very excited about the opportunity this has given us to improve the learning facilities for our beautiful children. We are hoping to begin the process of further improvements to our facilities in the near future.

Technology-This year we are reducing the number of excursions and the length of some excursions. Year 5 will now longer go on an overnight excursion and we are reducing the Canberra excursion from two nights to one as we are reprioritizing our expenditure so that we can build up our resources in other areas one of these being technology. At present, it is very difficult to provide enough technology to meet all our needs at the school. Much of what we have is old so we have decided to reduce some costs for parents reducing excursion expenses so that we can introduce a technology levy of \$60 per child to enable us to update and improve these resources for your children. Most of the schools in the diocese have similar levies to enable them to continue to upgrade and enhance the technology resources which are an essential component of schools.

Technology in the classroom enables the use of more interactive educational tools, which allows for a dynamic learning experience that directly benefits students. Web 2.0 interaction involves not only sharing ideas and information with someone else but also receiving feedback. As classroom computer technology is being used for different types of communication (for presentation, for class

interaction, and for collaboration), students are required to be readers, writers, editors, and publishers and must be willing to collaborate and co-create closely with others -- all skills that are critical for students to learn as they grow and enter the workplace. To provide the best possible education for your children it is necessary to introduce this levy to enable us to continue to provide a relevant and stimulating learning environment for the children.

Learning and Teaching and Attendance- Many of you would aware of recent articles in the papers about children's attendance at school and how important it is for them to be at school every day to ensure they are getting the maximum benefit from the instruction they receive. As you would be aware that last year we reorganized the school day to maximize the instruction time for your children by doing this we created an extra two weeks of instruction time. We have also reorganized our learning support structures which means that every available teacher is in the classroom from 9am each day instructing the children in reading. Reading groups commence next week which is a lot earlier than in previous years. I am saying this to let you know that our focus is your children's learning, building their confidence and enabling them to be successful. You can assist us in our efforts in maximizing instruction time by ensuring that your children are at school each day at 8:50am sharp ready to begin their day of learning. Children coming after 8:50 need to be accompanied to the office by an adult where a late to school form needs to be completed and signed by the parents This will be recorded as a partial absence in the school role. I know that you will support us with this renewed focus on the learning and ready to start the day at 8:50am sharp. Please refer to these new procedures on page 3 of this newsletter.

Late to School Notes

We have been advised by the Catholic Education Office that any child that arrives at school after the bell has gone is required to have a late note. Parents must accompany their child to the Office and fill out a "Late to School" form. There will be no more "late passes". Late School Forms will then be given to the class teacher and recorded in the Roll as a "Partial Absence". Please try and have your child to school on time as this can be disruptive to the class as well as your child missing valuable information at the beginning of the school day.

Leave from school during the school term

In the past parents wishing to take their children out of school for any period of time were asked to obtain and fill out an "Exemption from School" form that was handed in for the Principal for approval. These exemptions were not included with the students absences. Please note the following changes to the School Attendance Register Codes- commencing 27 Jan. 2015

The Minister for Education has approved changes to the use of the Attendance Register codes for 2015.

These changes will implement the *ACARA National Standards for Student Attendance Data Reporting*. ACARA developed the National Standards to establish nationally consistent parameters for the collection and reporting of student attendance data.

Holidays

As part of the implementation of the National Standards, holidays taken by students outside of school vacation periods will now be **included as absences**. A Certificate of Exemption can no longer be granted for this purpose.

Families are encouraged to holiday or travel during school vacations. If travel during school term is necessary the following considerations apply:

- Leave of ten (10) or more school days will require a formal application for leave in writing.
 This letter of request should be addressed to the Principal prior to commencing the leave period indicating the specific reason or purpose for the request of leave.
- If the principal accepts the reason for the absence, the absence will be marked as "L"
- If the principal does not believe the absence is in the student's best interests and does not accept the reason, the absence is unjustified and will be recorded as "A"
- If the period of absence is in excess of 50 days, the student may be eligible to enrol in Distance Education.

*For that period the student's enrolment transfers to the distance education school. Please Note: A student cannot be enrolled in more than one school concurrently (including Distance Education).

Allergies—Important Information

Dear Parents,

Schools cater for many differences that children present, academic, emotional, social and health issues.

I Throughout our school, we have children with I life threatening allergies. This is a serious I matter, one that the school must address. I Therefore, we appeal to all parents to assist us I in caring for these children by considering the I type of foods you pack for your own child's I lunch.

Our aim is to minimize the amount of **peanut** and **nut** products brought into the school and avoid all foods that contain **nuts**. These foods are extremely dangerous to our children with allergies. Common foods that trigger an allergic reaction are listed below and we ask that they **not** be brought to school at **any time**.

- I⇒ Peanuts including M & M peanuts
- I⇒ Cashews, hazelnuts, almonds, walnuts and all tree nuts
- ı⇒ Peanut butter
- ı⇒ Nutella
- I ⇒ Sesame seeds remember some bread
 I rolls have sesame seeds on them including some McDonald's hamburger buns
- Foods that contain satay e.g. Thai,Malaysian, Indonesian dishes
- Chocolate blocks, biscuits and lollies
- Whole egg boiled egg, curried egg.

Our canteen does not sell any of the items above. In the case of a child bringing a nut product to school, teachers will bring the matter to the attention of parents.

If peanut or nuts are **not** on the ingredient list of a particular packaged food but the food has the statement:

"MAY CONTAIN TRACES OF NUT......" this food may be brought to school and consumed only by non-allergic children.

Due to safety concerns, we discourage children from sharing food. We would also appreciate parents speaking with children regarding this matter.

We thank you for helping us to provide a safe environment for all of our children.

TO THE FAMILIES WHO HAVE CHILDREN THEY WISH TO BE PREPARED FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF PENANCE (RECONCILIATION), FIRST HOLY COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION IN 2015

In 2011, the Diocese of Parramatta released a revised *Sacraments of Initiation Policy* for children preparing for the above mentioned sacraments. The process of preparation for these sacraments remains as a parish based, family centred program which creates particular opportunities for parents to continue sharing their faith with their child at the appropriate time. The sequence for the reception of these sacraments has returned to the order that you may remember as a child.

The Sacraments of Initiation are **Baptism**, **First Holy Communion** and **Confirmation**. The Sacrament of **Penance**, sometimes called *Reconciliation* or *Confession*, is also an important part of the journey of faith for all of us. It is necessary to receive this Sacrament before you are able to receive the Sacrament of First Holy Communion.

As with all Sacramental Programs it is essential that parents and children are involved. While the students are supported by religious studies in the schools, the actual preparation takes place on a parish and home level. Parents and children are required to attend Sunday Mass and classes, and parents are helped by Facilitators who conduct the sessions.

Each year there are opportunities for your children to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. This is based on the presumption that they have already received the Sacrament of Baptism, as this is the pre-requisite for all other Sacraments. Usually the Sacrament of Penance is received in Year Two. First Holy Communion may be received the year after the Sacrament of Penance is received. Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation may begin when your child has entered Year 5 or Year 6 and have already made their First Holy Communion.

Parents have an essential role in discerning when their children are ready to be prepared for the Sacraments. When they believe this is the case they should present the children for registration in the appropriate Sacramental Program.

There is a definite commitment required of families involved in Sacramental Programs. Parents will have to attend one or two *Parent Education Evenings* in regard to the Sacraments concerned. There will also be an *Enrolment Ceremony* conducted during Mass on a Sunday morning. <u>Attendance at the 8:45am Sunday masses and all</u> classes during the Sacramental Preparation Program are compulsory.

Please Note: What does 'Parish-Based Preparation Programs mean?

What this means in practice is that families need to present their children to their own parish community for preparation. In other words for people to be eligible to receive the sacrament in St. Andrew's Parish, Marayong, they need to fulfil one of the following criteria --

The family must live within the parish boundaries of the Parish and / or

The families need to have chosen this parish as their parish community and this is expressed by ...

- their registering as parishioners of this Parish and
- by their participation in the life of this parish community.

If you do not live within the parish boundaries of St Andrew's, or are not registered as a parishioner of the parish, you will need to explain why you are seeking the Sacraments here at St Andrew's. This should be done before the Registration Night. It will require an appointment with one of the Priests or the Sacramental Coordinator. Attendance at the schools in the parish does not automatically make one a parishioner of this parish. As all Sacramental Programs are parish based, it is normally the case that Sacraments are received in the parish where you live or the parish where you worship and are involved.

If your child was baptised at a Church other than St Andrew's Marayong, you will need to bring along a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate.
