#### From the Principal

#### **Dear Parents**

Most parents would be hopeful that the observation that, "Children will be a great comfort to you in your old age," is true for them when the time comes; that time might come sooner than expected, if the second part of the observation is true, "and they help you reach it faster, too!" Lionel Kauffman.

Parents are in constant demand from their children but, thankfully, those demands are mostly about food, shelter and pocket money. When demands of a more serious nature arise, such as bullying, we parents need to be immediately available to avoid the prospect of real damage being done to the self-image and self-confidence of our children. However, parents need to be sure that bullying is what actually occurred and that it wasn't taunting or teasing.

Bullying is not accidental but intentional and, whatever its form, its intention is to hurt the other person. Bullying is an aggressive and negative behaviour and can occur regularly over a lengthy period of time. Taunting does not contain a physical component but makes fun of a person with the intention of hurting their feelings. Taunting tends to cause embarrassment to the other person by making them become red-faced or teary or visibly frightened. Teasing is somewhat harmless and occurs when a person pokes fun at another person and usually receives a return serve. Neither person feels hurt, because hurt is not intended nor directed at something distinguishing about the other person, such as their speech or appearance.

As parents, we need to be careful that we don't protect our children too much for, if we do, we aren't empowering them to deal with conflict and challenges that life pops up with. If we want our children to be resilient and able to develop a healthy self image and positive relationships, even through disagreement and conflict, then, we have to allow them some practice at facing their physical, emotional and social challenges with minimal interference from us and other adults. If we are always there for every minor incident, our children will run the risk of growing up unable to look after themselves in adult social situations. Sometimes children are reluctant to tell adults about bullying, because they feel embarrassed and ashamed that it's happening; they might worry that their parents will be disappointed. They might even feel that it's their own fault and that if they looked and acted differently, it wouldn't be happening. When a child does seek help, they need to be praised for being courageous enough to talk about what's happening to them. They need to be reassured that it's the bully who's behaving badly, not them, and that together you can work out a plan of action. Bullying has many styles and motives and devising a strategy to eliminate it will depend on the individual circumstance. However, there are some basic principles that will suit most circumstances and these principles might include: Advise your child not to respond to bullying by fighting or bullying back. This can easily escalate into violence, trouble and someone getting injured. Advise that it's natural to be upset by the bully, because that's what bullies thrive on. Practise not reacting, or looking upset or becoming teary. Advise telling the bully very firmly to stop what they are doing and then calmly walk away. By ignoring the bully you show you don't care. Encourage your child to get with friends that help their confidence; find activities that help your child feel confident and strong. Be a good example of kindness and leadership. Our children learn a lot about power relationships from watching us.

#### Naplan Online Readiness Testing- Year 3 and Year 5

NAPLAN, in 2019, will be conducted as an online test. In preparation for this all Catholic schools in the Parramatta Diocese will participate in a practice NAPLAN Readiness test this term. The aim of the practice test is to assess our technology capacity. The practice test also allows children to experience and become familiar with how the testing looks and feels.

The testing is **not** an **assessment of student ability.** The only information we will receive about the practice testing will be in relation to technology. Our practice testing period for Year 3 and Year 5 will be between Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September and Friday 8<sup>th</sup> September. Year 3 will sit one test covering reading, language conventions and Mathematics. Year 5 will sit 2 tests- one covering reading, language conventions and Mathematics and the second will be writing. Teachers will provide opportunities for children to practice for the practice test over the coming weeks. More detailed information for parents will be send home with all children in Years 3 and Year 5 on Monday.

# Free Dental Check - Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> August

The Dental staff will bring portable dental chairs and lights. The dental clinician will use sterilised equipment and wear a new pair of latex free gloves for each child.

Consent forms will be sent home for each child and should be returned as soon as possible to the teacher with all questions completed. Ticked **Yes or No** and signed by the parent/ guardian.

Each student (with **Medicare** Number and the consent form ticked **Yes** and **signed by a parent**) will be eligible to have a dental checkup.

A letter (result sheet) will be sent home with each child on the assessment day. This will indicate how the parent should follow-up the dental assessment.

Parents will not need to contact the dental clinic, unless otherwise indicated on their result sheet

The child's details will be entered onto the hospital computer data base and will remain confidential.

Treatment appointments will be offered on a prioritised basis and sent *directly to the child's address*. Students with *urgent treatment needs* will be offered treatment appointments first.

Parents may choose to make an appointment with their Private Dentist if the result sheet indicates their child requires treatment.

### Children from grades 1, 3, 5 will not be assessed at school.

Parents with children in Pre-school, Years 1,3 & 5 or children suffering dental pain or trauma, may call the Western Sydney Local Health District call centre on:

Free \* dental care is available at NSW public dental clinics for all children under 18 years of age.

NSW Health suggests all children aged 0-18 have a Dental check up every 1 to 2 years and

should have their teeth brushed twice a day
