For the last couple of weeks, the new kinders for 2018 have been attending the kindy transition. It is always exciting for us to see the next group of children arriving at school, ready to embark on the next phase of their little lives. It can be scary getting used to all the new routines and the fact that they have to share the teachers time with so many other children. It can also be an anxious time for many parents as they see their child come under the influence of another significant adult perhaps for the first time in their short lives. It is important to remember that this is all part of growing up. School is a safe place to experience success but more importantly disappointment. This might seem strange but I don't know anyone who is happy 100% of the time or hasn't experienced stress, pressure and disappointment. School is a great place for the children to sometimes experience these things because they are surrounded by lots of people who will help them through these feelings, not take them away, but help them through. Over my many years in this job, I have seen an increase in well intentioned parents trying to ensure that their children are always happy wanting to protect them from trouble, disappointment or stress which is natural. What we need to do is walk with them and help them through these feelings not stop them from experiencing them. This will help them be able to deal with these feelings during their adult life.

Our kindy transition program is progressing well. The new kindy's are so cute and many of them are really looking forward to commencing school to join their older brothers and sisters. What a great privilege it is for us to play such an important part in the children's lives as they grow towards being independent people. At present, we look to be having somewhere between 110 and 120 kinder enrolments for next year. This is the biggest number of enrolments we have had for quite a few years. It is great to see so many families taking advantage of our new learning spaces.

As you can see we have moved into the new learning spaces and work continues to progress on the grounds. I want to thank the community and especially the staff for the patience, understanding and support as we made this change. There is absolutely no doubt that we will all benefit from the changes that we continue to make to provide the best possible learning environment for the children. This is an exciting time in the history of the school and I am very grateful to be part of it.

Children's Safety- Your child's safety is our number one priority and we need your help to ensure that no accidents happen at Kiss and Ride particularly in the morning drop off. Could you please stay in the car when dropping off in the morning and allow the children to get out of the car on the kerb side of the carpark. It is best that they have their bags as they get out of the car and are not moving behind the vehicle to collect their bags from the car boot. Remember the kiss and ride area is just for dropping off not parking. Thank you for your cooperation.

### SCHOOL OPAL CARDS – IMPORTANT INFORMATION

TAPPING ON AND OFF IS IMPORTANT SO BUS SERVICES ARE NOT CANCELLED DUE TO THE LACK OF PATRONAGE.

An important requirement of School Opal Card is the need for students to tap on and off as this gathers data for the bus company to ensure the appropriate level of service is offered to students.

Please be aware that Busways will be conducting checks over the coming months. All Opal Cards need to be carried with the student.

Applications for 2018 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) and Term Bus Pass (TBP) travel entitlements are now open.

In coming days students who hold an SSTS entitlement and are changing grade bands i.e. going from year 2 to 3 or year 6 to 7 <u>and changing school</u>, and students whose entitlement was approved under a medical condition, will receive notification by email or post informing them of the pending expiry of their entitlement. TBP holders will also receive notification.

Students enquiring about pending cancellation should be advised to go online to <a href="https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails">https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</a> to update details/make application for next year's entitlement.

Application needs to be made before 31 December 2017 to ensure their entitlement is updated and their current card is not cancelled. If application is made after the expiry of their entitlement (31 December) the system will automatically cancel their card and a new one will need to be issued.

**Please note:** Students who are changing grade band and are <u>remaining at the same school</u> will not receive notification and <u>do not need to reapply</u> (the system now automatically validates a student's on-going eligibility if at the same school and going from infants to primary or primary to secondary). Where a student meets the new eligibility the system will automatically update their entitlement and card.

Students in the Opal area applying for a SSTS or TBP entitlement for the first time will receive their card (posted to the nominated address) a week or two before the commencement of 2018 classes. Please let students know new cards for 2018 are not posted in 2017 or during the Christmas / New Year period.

School-based fees will also be limited to a 3.6% increase to ensure we have consistency across our Diocese. School-based fees cover the costs of important things such as technology and school administration.

#### Diocesan Building Levy - 2018

The Diocesan Building Levy enables us, through our capital works program, to meet the demand for new schools and new classes in high growth areas, and to continue to maintain all schools to a high standard.

All families with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College Kingswood are required to pay the annual Diocese of Parramatta Diocesan Building Levy. This levy has replaced the various building levies that parents previously paid to school building funds (managed by either parishes or schools). The levy for 2018 is \$783 per family, payable in three equal instalments of \$261 in Terms 1, 2 and 3.

## Annual Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents - 2018

The Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents for 2018 is \$1,935 per student, payable in three equal instalments of \$645. The fee applies to new students on the following visa numbers: 173, 401, 402, 411, 415, 416, 417, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 423, 426, 427, 428, 442, 456, 457, 459, 462, 476, 485, 497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 884, 944, 956, 976 and 977 including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on bridging visas 010 to 090.

Families charged this fee in 2013 will continue to be charged on a *per family* basis to the eldest student whilst the family has continuous current students.

Thank you for your continuing support of Catholic education, support that allows us to provide students with exciting learning experiences within our Catholic faith environment.




