From the Principal

Welcome back to the new school year. I hope you were all able to spend some quality time with your families over the Christmas and New Year period. As I have said so many times before the children just grow up so fast that it is important to take every opportunity to enjoy quality time with your loved ones. We are just so busy when we are working paying the bills and raising the children and are constantly bombarded with all the bad news regarding the state of the world, we often forget about the most important part of our lives and how lucky we are to share in good family relationships and all the joy this brings to us. "Sometimes we can lose touch with the purpose of what we are doing in our life; if we let go of our dream, we live without hope and to be without hope is to be without purpose."

Your child will learn best when they know that you are interested in what they are doing. One way you can show that interest is by your attendance at the parent information evenings. It is a chance for you and your children's new teacher to meet to discuss the year's activities and for you to learn about the class routines for the year.

As I always do at the beginning of each year I want to encourage you to take an active interest in your child's education and try to get up to the school to help. Please don't hesitate as you will always be given an honest response. It is always good to hear from you and give another perspective.

P/F Committee- This year we thought we would have our first meeting on Monday 19th February at 7pm. We are always looking for some people to help on this important committee. As with hospitals, schools rely on fundraising to purchase resources that we would otherwise not have. It is also a fun way to meet and enjoy each other's company. I would ask that you strongly consider attending and lending your support to this committee especially some of our new parents.

Focus on Student Attendance- Many of you would be aware of recent articles in the papers and on the television about children's attendance at school and how important it is for them to be at school every day to ensure they are getting the maximum benefit from the instruction they receive. There has been a renewed focus on attendance rates across the country because there is increasing evidence that a larger numbers of students are consistently absent from school. Our focus is your children's learning, building their confidence and enabling them to be successful. You can assist us in our efforts in maximizing instruction time by ensuring that your children are at school each day at 8:50am sharp ready to begin their day of learning. Children coming after 8:50 need to be accompanied to the office by an adult where a late to school form needs to be completed and signed by the parents **This will be recorded as a partial absence in the school roll.** I know that you will support us with our focus on the learning and ready to start the day at 8:50am sharp.

Term calendar- For anyone wishing to know what is coming up here at school please access the school calendar on the school website.

After school pickup/parking. It is always difficult at the beginning of each new school year with dismissal in the afternoons. I would ask all of you to remember the importance of safety. Your children are precious and it is important that everyone is able to leave the school grounds safely. It is also important that we look after the school's neighbour's in the afternoon and not block their driveways as does happen. I understand the difficulties with the pick up in the afternoons. Please do not enter the parish or staff car park for pick up in the afternoon.

Middle gate closed Tuesday, 6th and Wednesday 7th Feb-The demountable building near the church will be moved on Tuesday, 6th February. This will mean that the middle gate access will be closed while this is occurring. When this is completed the gate will reopen. We are only expecting it to be closed on Tuesday and Wednesday at this stage. Access to the school will be via the front gate adjacent to the library and the top gate near the hall for these days.

I hope that you enjoy the year. I look forward to all the great things that we have planned for your children. I trust that I will continue to see many parents involving themselves positively in the life of the school throughout the year as we continue to work together in the interests of the children.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Dear Parents,

Schools cater for many differences that children present, academic, emotional, social and health issues.

Throughout our school, we have children with **life threatening** allergies. This is a serious matter, one that the school must address. Therefore, we appeal to all parents to assist us in caring for these children by considering the type of foods you pack for your own child's lunch.

Our aim is to minimize the amount of **peanut** and **nut** products brought into the school and avoid all foods that contain **nuts**. These foods are extremely dangerous to our children with allergies. Common foods that trigger an allergic reaction are listed below and we ask that they **not** be brought to school at **any time**.

Peanuts - including M & M peanuts

Cashews, hazelnuts, almonds, walnuts and all tree nuts

Peanut butter

Nutella

Sesame seeds – remember some bread rolls have sesame seeds on them including some McDonald's hamburger buns

Foods that contain satay e.g. Thai, Malaysian, Indonesian dishes

Chocolate – blocks, biscuits and lollies

Whole egg – boiled egg, curried egg

In the case of a child bringing a nut product to school, teachers will bring the matter to the attention of parents.

If peanut or nuts are **not** on the ingredient list of a particular packaged food but the food has the statement:

"MAY CONTAIN TRACES OF NUT......"

this food may be brought to school and consumed only be **non-allergic children**.

Due to safety concerns, we discourage children from sharing food. We would also appreciate parents speaking with children regarding this matter.

We thank you for helping us to provide a safe environment for all of our children.

KISS AND DROP

The Kiss and Drop Zone at the Church undercroft enables parents to drop their children off safely and quickly. The intention is that drivers do not wait in these zones and that they stay in the vehicle at all times. The children should exit on the left hand side of the car only with their bags for a safe and easy exit.



We want to ensure that all children are safe within this area.

Please note:

- The Kiss and Drop area is a NO PARKING AREA.
- Never double park or overtake within this area.
- Drivers are to remain in their vehicles at all times.
- Move entirely to the front of the area. Please wait your turn to drop off children.
- When you leave home ensure children are in their seats and have their bags with them. Bags should not be in the boot or back of car unless you are parking in a designated parking area.
- Make sure the children use the footpath side of the car when getting out.
- Never double park
 - Do not park in the Staff Car Park
 - If you feel the need for a longer goodbye, please park your car in an appropriate spot and take your time. Please do not turn right when exiting the car park in the morning.

Please find below the 2018 Diocesan school fees schedule which includes a modest 3.6% increase on the fees from 2017.

School-based fees will also be limited to a 3.6% increase to ensure we have consistency across our Diocese. School-based fees cover the costs of important things such as technology and school administration.

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IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

Diocesan Building Levy - 2018

The Diocesan Building Levy enables us, through our capital works program, to meet the demand for new schools and new classes in high growth areas, and to continue to maintain all schools to a high standard.

All families with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College Kingswood are required to pay the annual Diocese of Parramatta Diocesan Building Levy. This levy has replaced the various building levies that parents previously paid to school building funds (managed by either parishes or schools). The levy for 2018 is \$783 per family, payable in three equal instalments of \$261 in Terms 1, 2 and 3.

Annual Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents - 2018

The Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents for 2018 is **\$1,935 per student, payable in three equal instalments of \$645.** The fee applies to new students on the following visa numbers: 173, 401, 402, 411, 415, 416, 417, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 423, 426, 427, 428, 442, 456, 457, 459, 462, 476, 485, 497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 884, 944, 956, 976 and 977 including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on bridging visas 010 to 090.

Families charged this fee in 2013 will continue to be charged on a *per family* basis to the eldest student whilst the family has continuous current students.

Smartphone school to parent communication

Skoolbag is a mobile App for your school to communicate directly to both parents and students. It works through both smart phones and smart devices (such as iPads and Android Tablets). Ideal for:

- > School, free push notification alerts
- > School events
- > School newsletters
- > School documents
- > School RSS feeds
- > School social media (Facebook, Twitter)
- 5koolbag delivers school notices directly to parents and students

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

iPhone & iPad Users

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "install".

4. If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will then be visible, click "Free" then "install".

5. When installed click "Open"

- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

Android Users

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app. 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.

- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.

5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).

- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

School Opal Card – Please Assist!

This is being forwarded to you by Busways, the bus operator that provides your school bus services, regarding student use of School Opal card.

An important requirement of School Opal is the need for students to Tap On and Tap Off when they travel to and from school.

Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services.

If students don't Tap on and Tap off, services may be cancelled or reduced due to the lack of recorded patronage. With this in mind, we again ask for your assistance in reminding your students that tapping on and off at the beginning and end of each trip is one of the conditions of using a School Opal card. This in turn helps us ensure we are able to provide the appropriate level of service to your students.

To assist the schools, Busways is developing a campaign to further promote and encourage the use of School Opal. We will also continue to conduct boarding checks on School Opal cards over the coming months. Students without an Opal Card will be given a brochure to take home identifying how they can get an Opal Card.

Please support Busways staff with afternoon boarding's and checks to ensure minimal delays to bus departure times and demonstrate a united front to students on bus travel and Opal Card use.
