

When we see children exploring their environment, tinkering, investigating, asking questions, searching for meaning, looking for information then we know that they are curious and wanting to learn. Curiosity helps children to be more receptive to learning.

Curiosity can supercharge learning but as we know not all curious children gain the highest marks. Most curious children are inquisitive and usually know what they know but are so very keen to learn what they don't know. Curiosity is more than just paying attention. It's the excitement of exploring, a powerful drive within them to learn something new and often they are so preoccupied with the learning that that's all we hear about.

At St Andrew's we provide great opportunities for children to explore their curiosity. Teachers use a strategy called, "Think Alouds," during modelled reading and writing sessions- to explain what and why they are thinking, to refine, to expand and to be curious and search for other means. Our Project Based Learning (PBL) fosters curiosity through inquiry. Curiosity is nurtured and becomes contagious as children work cooperatively together creating new and innovative ideas. Our Maker Space, where curiosity is in built as children are allowed to tinker, explore, problem solve, take risks and create.

Ask your children about what they think is happening in the old uniform shop. There are signs up, warning tape across the doors and black sheeting covering the glass. Loads of curious children have been stopping to ask me whether I can tell them what's happening- some ideas they have shared include a "slime factory", a "gaming area", a "robot factory" and a " teachers hub for relaxation."

The prayer – Beatitudes of the Children- highlights many blessings, including CUROSITY

#### Beatitudes of the Children

**Blessed** are the children who have someone who believes in them and someone who has high hopes for them.

Blessed are the children who have someone to whom they can carry their problems ... unafraid.

Blessed are the children to whom life is a book of knowledge.

**Blessed** are the children who are allowed to pursue their <u>curiosity</u> into every worthwhile field of information.

**Blessed** are the children who have someone who understands that childhood griefs are real and call for understanding and sympathy.

**Blessed** are the children who are led gently by the hand along the pathway of life by someone who is guide, companion and inspiration.

Blessed are the children whose efforts to achieve have found encouragement.

**Blessed** are the children who have learned freedom from selfishness through responsibility and cooperation.

**Blessed** is the home, community, school or nation, which sees in the children the hope of the future and dedicates their efforts to the realisation of that hope.

#### WHAT GRADES ARE INVOLVED?

Year 3: Wednesday August 29th Week 6

Year 5: Tuesday 28th August Week 6

#### WHAT IS THE READINESS TEST

Our school will run a school readiness test during Term 3.

The test will ensure schools are ready to undertake NAPLAN Online the following year. It also allows students and teachers to familiarise themselves with the online system and experience the test delivery method.

Since the test is not an assessment, it won't be marked and results won't be distributed.

# CAPTIVATE SHOWCASE DRESS REHEARSAL & PERFOMANCES UPDATE - MONDAY 20<sup>th</sup>, Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> & Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> August -

In Week 5 the Choir and Ensemble students will be performing over 2 nights at the Captivate 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Showcase at the Quay Centre, Sydney Olympic Park, along with over 3000 other students in the Diocese. They are very excited about being a part of this unique performance event.

Last week a note went home for all Captivate Ensemble and Choir students for the last rehearsal, which is the major dress rehearsal at the Quay Centre on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> August. If your child has missed this note, please see the Office for a copy. To finalise buses, these notes and money need to be returned by Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> August (Week 4). As the rehearsal is from 9am - 2.30pm, students will need to be at school by 7.45am as the bus will leave promptly at 8am. Students will not return to school until after 3.30pm as no school is permitted to leave early due to the huge volume of people exiting the venue. These times will be confirmed in a note home next week once more information has come from Captivate.

Showcase tickets are being emailed out this week to the address supplied on the return slip. They have all ticket requests so will be processing these directly. It is unlikely that any additional tickets will be available.

### Dress Rehearsal Information (Week 5, Monday 20th August)

#### Clothing for all performers

All students are to come dressed in long black pants, black shoes & black socks and their school sport t-shirt.

Performance t-shirts will be distributed on the day to each school. All black pants are to be full in length and material. No pants are to have rips, tears, logos or additional colour. Tights are not allowed as a substitute for pants.

### Instrumentalists

In addition to the above clothing requirements, please also bring music and instrument.

All students are to bring a small bag/ backpack with their recess, lunch and a water bottle. There will be no facilities for students to purchase food. Bags are to be labelled with the student's name and school and no devices or valuables must be brought to the rehearsal as no responsibility will be taken for lost or misplaced items.

### Performance Nights Information (Week 5, Tuesday 21st and Wednesday 22nd August)

Students are to attend BOTH performance nights, even if parents are not attending to watch. A reminder that parents are responsible for both drop off and pick up of their child/ren for the performances, there will be no school transport provided. On BOTH performance nights, students need to arrive by 5:30pm IN FULL COSTUME and be dropped off near Door 5 (follow signs from P3) where they will be met by a CEDP staff member and directed to their school's allocated area where we will meet them. They are to have had dinner and are only permitted to bring in a small snack to eat at interval and a bottle of water - no food purchasing will be available.

The discounted (\$15) parking station is P3. There is also a 30-minute free parking arrangement in place at P3 for drop off and pick up if you are not attending both the performances. The collection point for after the performance will go home in a note next week once we receive our designated area. Parents will not be able to collect their children from inside the venue. In the event of rain, alternative arrangements will be communicated on the night.

We will continue to send updates home as we are provided with information from Captivate. We look forward to showcasing the hard work of our St Andrew's students.



### Free Dental Check - Thursday 16th August

The Dental staff will bring portable dental chairs and lights. The dental clinician will use sterilised equipment and wear a new pair of latex free gloves for each child.

Consent forms will be sent home for each child and should be returned as soon as possible to the teacher with all questions completed. Ticked **Yes or No** and signed by the parent/ guardian.

Each student with the **fully completed** consent form ticked **Yes** and **signed** by a parent will be eligible to have a dental checkup. (**Please ensure all details such as Medicare number and date of birth are correct**)

A letter (result sheet) will be sent home with each child on the assessment day. This will indicate how the parent should follow-up the dental assessment.

Parents will not need to contact the dental clinic, unless otherwise indicated on their result sheet

The child's details will be entered onto the hospital computer data base and will remain confidential.

Treatment appointments will be offered on a prioritised basis and sent *directly to the child's address*. Students with *urgent* treatment needs will be offered treatment appointments first.

Parents may choose to make an appointment with their Private Dentist if the result sheet indicates their child requires treatment.

### Children from grades 1, 3, 5 will not be assessed at school.

Parents with children in Pre-school, Years 1,3 & 5 or children suffering dental pain or trauma, may call the Western Sydney Local Health District call centre on:

Free \* dental care is available at NSW public dental clinics for all children under 18 years of age.

NSW Health suggests all children aged 0-18 have a Dental check up every 1 to 2 years and

should have their teeth brushed twice a day
